Headline Outcomes 2021-2022

- ❖ In the ARP 88% of pupils made good progress holistically and 27% made outstanding holistic progress.
- On Langdale Site (Primary and Middle departments) 74% of pupils made good progress holistically and 20% made outstanding holistic progress.
- ❖ In KS3 84% of students made good progress holistically and 8% made outstanding holistic progress.
- ❖ In KS4 84% of students made good progress holistically and 20% made outstanding holistic progress.
- ❖ In total **82**% of all Silverdale pupils made good progress holistically and **18**% of that group made outstanding holistic progress.

New cabinets and white goods have been installed and the room now looks professional and welcoming. The Art Room and Cookery Room now have interactive white boards and the Art Room refurbishment will be completed by the end of academic year 2023.
	Enhance the grounds of the school by creating gardens to support Post 16 pathways and qualifications and develop relaxing areas to support wellbeing and positive mental health	The gardens area have had significant development and the school site now offers green spaces to relax in. There are seating areas, growing spaces and beds full of plants and flowers. The Oasis department has a large garden comprising of a large poly tunnel, wild life pond, sheds, vegetable beds and a seating area with a fire pit. Students have worked alongside staff and visiting experts to develop this area.
