	Colour Chaos	Portraits	LS Lowry
What We Will Learn	This unit of work pupils will discover all about colours, using and mixing their own colours to create quality art work.	Pupils will learn all about portraits, and use of different materials and techniques when making their own. The children will also have the opportunity to explore the work of Pablo Picasso, Paul Klee, Henri Matisse and Andy Warhol, and create artwork inspired by them.	This Lowry unit will teach pupils about 19th century painter LS Lowry. The children will have the opportunity to explore the life and work of Lowry and to learn about the industrial landscape that provided the subject of many of his paintings. Each lesson in the unit focuses on improving a key skill in art and design; comparing works of art, colour mixing, perspective, drawing figures, drawing buildings and scissor skills. At the end of the unit children will have used their knowledge and skills to create a multimedia collage in the style of the artist.
What We Will Do	Pupils will learn how to mix colours and create art work with colours they have mixed. They will mix shades, tints and discuss their thoughts and ideas about if colours make them feel warm or cold.	Pupils will be able to create a portrait that includes the key features. They will discuss features create different portraits using a range of techniques, including drawing, painting, and collage. Pupils will talk about the work of a range of portrait artists and describe differences and similarities between different practises.	Pupils will mix paint from Lowry Colours. They will paint a seascape. They will draw simple buildings and be able to discuss and point out the matchstick figures in Lowry's paintings. They will practice drawing simple matchstick figures.
Skills Learned	Pupils will develop their skills about colour knowledge, they will understand the difference between primary and secondary colours.	Pupils will use a wide range of art and design techniques developing prior skills learned colour and pattern.	Pupils will further develop their skills and knowledge to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space
