	What We Will Learn	Students will read poems both as shared text and within groups.	The unit is designed to build upon novels studied in Years 5 and 6. Students will read the novel as a whole class. They will participate in drama activities and learn about the key themes of the play by putting them into contemporary contexts and produce a poster for a theatrical performance of the play.
