What We Will Learn	Pupils will learn about how to use pencil, colour, mosaic design, puppet making and sculpture to create quality artwork that shows progression in their skills. The children will also have the opportunity to explore the work of a range of 'Insect' artists, in particular, Louise Bourgeois and Jennifer Angus.	Pupils will learn about how to use pencil, colour, paint, clay peppers and textiles to create quality art work that shows progression in their skills. The children will also have the opportunity to explore the work of the designer, Carl Warner, textile artist, Michael Brennand-Wood and Italian painter, Caravaggio.	This 'Bodies' themed unit pupils will learn about how to use pen, charcoal, felt tip, make maquettes, make paper clothes and sculpt Giacometti-inspired models to create quality artwork that shows progression in skills. The children will also have the opportunity to explore the work of 'Bodies' artists Julian Opie, Alberto Giacometti and Henry Moore.
What We Will Do	Pupils will produce an observational drawing. Show colours and draw details carefully. They will design a mosaic and make a puppet. They will design and make a 3D model.	Pupils will produce an observational drawing in charcoal or pencil, they will experiment with textiles. They will mix and select their own colours. They will make a clay model of a fruit or vegetable and paint it the correct colours.	Pupils will produce an observational drawing and make a maquette. They will draw a person in pen and be able to show shapes and colours by designing clothes out of paper.
Skills Learned	Pupils will be able to transfer their knowledge and skills about shading techniques and choose the appropriate colours of equal depth of shading.	Pupils will be able to transfer their knowledge and skills about shading techniques and choose the appropriate colours of equal depth of shading and texture.	Pupils will further develop their skills and knowledge of using line, colour, shape, form and texture.
