What We Will Learn	This unit of work pupils will discover all about themselves, their likes, dislikes and their interests, they will be able to link their skills, interests to job opportunities.	Pupils will build on prior knowledge about team work and how to cost and produce a Christmas product.	Pupils will build on prior learning this unit is based on employability, they will access skills that are needed to get a job and they will learn about the process of an interview.	Pupils will build on prior learning about a range of different job opportunities and the skills that are required to be able to do a certain type of job. They will learn about fairness, time management and how to keep themselves safe in the work place.	This unit will build on prior learning about transport and the part it plays in work and life. It is all about how to use the correct mode of transport for different distances of work or leisure. They will use the internet to access google maps.
What We Will Do	Pupils will describe their personality and their interests. They will be able to identify and explain how to get what they want. They will be able to identify key features needed within careers, employability, enterprise activities and life experiences.	Pupils will be use their creative skills and initiative to produce a product to sell. They will consider packaging and design. They will discuss their spending outcomes and incomes and look at profit margin. They will be able to evidence their work as part of a group project.	Pupils will give examples of what it means to have a career. They will apply for a job and follow the interview process. They will give examples of what people like and dislike about the work they do. Pupils will learn how to describe a local business, how it is run and the products and/or services it provides.	Pupils will describe the main types of employment in their local area: past, present and emerging. They will be able to discuss and recognise the harm caused by stereotyping and discrimination, and the importance of treating people fairly. Pupils will be able to understand how to keep themselves safe.	Pupils will give examples of how they could travel to different work destinations. They can plan a route to and from a place of work and understand the need to pay for transport and factor it into their budget. They will look at different modes of transport and the more complex role technology plays within transport.
Skills Learned	Pupils will be able to further develop and recognise the different skills and qualities involved with education and job opportunities.	Pupils will be able to transfer their skills of problem solving into a real life setting, they will be able to consider what a budget means and the skills involved with balancing a budget.	Pupils will develop their speaking and listening skills and they will be able to identify that certain jobs require certain skills or training and be able to reflect on their personal goals and achievements.	Pupils will further develop a range of soft skills, such as a positive attitude and will be able to communicate their future needs. They will identify their basic human rights and develop their knowledge of right and wrong within society.	Pupils will be able to identify key modes of transport. They will be able to identify and link between travel and technology. Pupils will be able to transfer their knowledge of statistics over into reading bus/train timetables.
